Minutes of February 16, 2024 Meeting

President Donna D. welcomed those in attendance.

February Birthdays: Dianne W., Janice W., Sherre M., Kristin A., Ann B., Jeanette M.

Donna asked if there where there any errors or omissions to the minutes of the January meeting as published in our newsletter? Hearing none, there was a motion to approve the minutes made by Peggy R. and seconded by Richard L. The motion carried with a round of ayes.

Treasurer Erma H., read the treasurer's report for January and February. The ending balance was 13,311.81. Donna D. asked if there where there any errors or omissions to the treasurer's report as read. Hearing none, there was a motion to approve the treasurer's report made by Jane S. and seconded by Ginger C. The motion carried with a round of ayes.

Donna thanked Maria S. for teaching the 4-patch stack and whack technique at the February 2nd Bee Meeting. The comments about the class were all how much fun the meeting was!

Donna thanked Ann B. for getting the new Beachplum Quilters Facebook page up and running so guickly.

Ann is also scheduling a mystery quilt for the Bee meeting, but anyone can participate. The instructions are going to go out as email blasts, so all members will see the requirements. But, the Bee meetings will have demos, tips and a final reveal next October. If you want the pattern/instructions mailed to you, there will be a \$5.00 fee to cover postage.

At the beginning of the meeting, Donna overlooked welcoming new member Sue P. and guest Linda. She did so at this time.

A Nomination Committee has been formed, and tasked with finding the guild officer nominations for 2024-2026 term. The committee is Dona S., Juanita G. and Ellen H. It would be great if you made their job easier and volunteered for an Office or Committee Chairmanship.

• 2024 Challenge Quilts (Dixie M. and Dianne W.) Donna apologized to anyone who had already filled out a registration form for the challenge quilts, as she realized there was a special registration form to be used and she did not post it to the web site. She had printed copies available and would ask Ivette R. to get the form fillable pdf on the website ASAP. Special attention to the fact that the bag with the crayons you were given should be attached to the bottom of the form. In lieu of that, the colors could be colored on the form and the color names written down. The challenge quilts will be presented at the March Meeting for the member vote. Remember to bring yours in!

The Sit N'Sew for Saturday, February 17 has been canceled. At this time we are in the process of figuring out how the Door Prize tote bags will be completed.

- Quilt Show Update: (Gloria S.) Donna read notes that Gloria had prepared, and various show chairs provided the members with additional updates.
- >COUNTRY STORE (Mary P.) So many great items are ready to sell. We will need handcarts, strong men and large capacity vehicles on Friday, April 12 to help move the items from the storage unit to the Elks Club. We will probably meet at 10am but that will be confirmed once we know what time the Pipes and Drapes will start set up.
- >QUILTING DEMOS (Paula P.) Demonstrators are needed for both Saturday and Sunday. If you have a particular skill and would like to share with fellow guilters and visitors, please let Paula know.
- >JUDGING (Dina N.) 32 risers are needed for under the judging tables, to raise the tables to a comfortable height. Please contact Dina if you can lend or donate a set of risers for the judging on Thursday, April 11. These are the type if risers that you put under bed legs to make the bed higher.

Dina will also be scheduling a zoom meeting for the judging volunteers, but anyone can join in to learn more about the process. An email will go out to all members with the information.

>QUILT REGISTRATION: (Erma H.) Please turn in your quilt registrations, with appropriate forms and fees, to Erma H. The quilts do not have to completed now for the registration photograph but final registration closes March 1, 2024. That's only two weeks away!

>BASKETS: (Carol C. & Marleen S.). Donations are needed for our Basket Raffle, whether it be product or money. Also, baskets are needed too, coordinate with Carol. Just as a reminder the categories are: QUILTING, ITALIAN, COFFEE & TEA, SPA and CHOCOLATE & LIQUOR.

>RAFFLE TICKETS: Dona S. is the raffle ticket coordinator. Please bring in your ticket stubs with money to her, and If possible take an additional book or two.

>APPRAISALS: Karen L. Dever, AQS Certified Quilt Appraiser will be available at our Show. Please take advantage of this service. If you don't have an appraisal, your quilt is only worth what you can document you spent on supplies to make it. Please contact Gloria S. to be placed on the schedule. Written: \$60.00 & Oral: \$30.00 (quilts made prior 1975).

>SILENT SMALL QUILT AUCTION: (Jeannette M.) Small quilts for the Silent Auction can be anything—a wall hanging, table topper, etc.— as long as it's smaller than a throw. There may be a special section with five or so of Joyce W's final works, and one would be larger at 55" \times 65". Looking into proper options for that display.

- Placemats (Pat O.) Pat told the members about how the recipients of the placemats are extremely grateful for and love receiving the placemats the guild members make. Richard L. mentioned he personally knows people who have received them and they take such good care of them and use them over and over for the joy they bring. The winners for the February donation prizes were Karen M. and Maria S.
- Programs: (Dina N.) Dina picked up at Crafty Fabric 100% cotton pillowcases that were made by a non-guild member, Linda R. Shore Surprise

May Workshop on Foundation Paper Piecing

Don't forget to sign up for the May Workshop - Shore Surprise. This is a Foundation Paper Piecing workshop and even though the blocks are a "surprise," they will be items related to our beloved Jersey Shore.

FPP is a fun technique that yields incredibly accurate quilt blocks and is often used to create precise shapes or pictures, or to sew very small pieces or odd angles. I love the perfect points it produces and the fact that it lends itself well to chain piecing. Most FPP patterns can be made with scraps - yardage is not necessary.

The cost of this workshop is \$50.00, which includes a kit. The kit contains the patterns printed on FPP paper (I will have 3 options for you to compare and decide which you like best), printed directions with a copy of the patterns for you to keep and a 12" Add a Quarter Ruler, all in a sturdy box you can keep for this and/or other projects.

These patterns are geared toward beginners, however it is also a good refresher course for more experienced quilters. The patterns will start out easy and get a little more challenging. You will be able to leave the workshop with a completed project - either table runner or wall hanging (your choice). Fabric list will be provided at the March workshop.

You will need to supply a sewing machine, scissors, neutral color thread, 1 or 2 sewing machine needles, your lunch and be ready to have some fun.

Please write a check out to Beachplum Quilters for the full amount of the workshop, space is limited. Feel free to call Dina with any questions.

Mystery Quilt

Welcome to our 2024 Bee Mystery Quilt journey called "Power Glitches". It is free and open to all Beachplum members. No sign up needed unless you prefer to pay for printed copies of the Clues. Our discussions, technique demonstrations & sharing of blocks will only happen at Bee Meetings.

You can use any fabrics you like. The important things to keep in mind - Pieces will be cut into squares & triangles and turned in all directions - Directional and large motif fabrics might be difficult to work with - Color values listed are important for contrast in the design.

The sample quilt in the Clues has a dark background. If you prefer a light background, it will work fine, just change the "Light" to "Dark" in the fabric list. My Tip: note your fabric choices next to the examples or attach swatches to the page. For a larger quilt, borders can be added. Do the math for a 45" x 63" center and buy more fabric. 4" border requires 1 yard of fabric. 3" inch border requires $\frac{3}{4}$ yard, etc.

2024 Bee Mystery Quilt "Power Glitches" by Debi Montgomery

Debi has designed a special quilt for us. She lives in New Zealand and has created many mystery patterns as Mystery Quilts Anonymous.

We are making a 45" x 63" quilt with 9-inch blocks using Half Square Triangles and Flying Geese. It requires 5 fabrics and no special tools.

Clues & other information will be emailed as PDF files to all members each month on the 1st Friday. Discussions & sharing of blocks will only happen at Bee Meetings. If you prefer to receive printed copies the cost is \$5.00. They can be picked up at Bee Meetings or mailed out afterwards. Please contact Ann to sign up and pay for printouts.

2024 Bee Mystery Quilt Schedule

March 1 – Email: Fabric Requirements List & Clue Schedule. A discussion on selecting fabrics with Ann's samples at the Bee Meeting. Gather fabrics from your stash and at our quilt show.

May 3 – Email: Clues 1 & 2. Sharing of fabrics choices at Bee meeting; demo of Half Square Triangle techniques & partial seams.

June 7 – Email Clue 3. Sharing blocks from Clues 1 & 2 at Bee meeting; demo of the No Waste Flying Geese technique.

July 5 – Email Clue 4 – no meeting

August 2 - Email Clue 5 - no meeting

September 6 – Email Clue 6 – Setting Reveal. Sharing of all blocks and laying them out at Bee meeting. Discussion of borders and other possibilities.

October 4 – Finished Mystery Quilts Showcase at Bee Meeting.

October 18 – Mystery Quilt Show and Tell at regular meeting.

What is a Mystery Quilt??? a quilt whose instructions are revealed in a series of clues and the overall design is unknown until the final clue is revealed. Fabric requirements are given at the onset and include details about light, medium and dark fabric, as well as fabric quantity. The final quilt design is a secret until the last clue and may be a total surprise. What fun!

Fabric Requirements

Background: 2-1/2 yards

Medium: 1/4 yard Light: 3/8 yard

Dark contrast: 1-3/4 yards (includes binding)

Medium contrast: 1/2 yard

The above are for using a dark background. If you prefer a light background, interchange the Background and Light yardages.


