

### Minutes of October 17, 2014 Meeting

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 by President Jackie Pearce.

Guests were introduced and returning member Kathy M. also attended. Welcome back!

Our block for our monthly quilt card is Buckeye Beauty, the state is Ohio and their state motto is "with God all things are possible." If you miss a month you will get credit by making in a charity quilt; in that case you should get a heart sticker from Ellen H. and put it on the back of your quilt card.

Paula P. introduced our speaker for the night: Gail Mahealani Small who spoke on Hawaiian culture and Hawaiian applique. There were still a couple of spaces available for the 10/18 and 10/25 workshops.

Minutes from last month's meeting were approved.

Linda F. (filling in for Ann B), read the treasury report. A motion to approved the report was made by Dona S. and seconded by Debbie P. Motion carried unanimously.

Linda F., chairperson for the Luncheon committee, asked the group to pick a theme from *Pearls*, *Pearls*, *Pearls* or *Pearls of the Jersey Shore*. The group chose *Pearls of the Jersey Shore*. Also working on the committee is Debbie P. who will be handling door prizes and Susan H. who will be handling publicity and baskets.

Since 2015 is our 30th anniversary we will be having a quilt challenge, chaired by Ann B. If you did not pick up your package for the challenge, see Ann. The cost of the kit is \$3.00, which includes a piece of fabric and the instructions for the challenge. The challenge is to be turned in at the March 2015 guild meeting and will be voted on at the luncheon.

Ellen H. spoke about charity quilts. A charity quilt workshop will be held Saturday, November 8th from 9 a.m. till 3 p.m. at the First Methodist church on the corner of Chestnut and Old Freehold Road in Toms River. Ellen has some fleece fabric donated by Burkholders that we will use in making charity quilts for children. Bring your sewing machine plus black or dark brown thread to use.

There were charity quilt kits at the meeting for people to pick up. Ellen H. established an incentive for making charity quilts: For each one you make you will receive a ticket to be entered in a raffle. The winner will receive a handmade miniature quilt rack made by Richard Hyers.

Ellen H. has labels made up for the charity quilts anyone makes; see Ellen if you need one. You are to write your first name and date on the label.

Marcia G. is still offering to quilt charity quilts. If you have one just drop it off at Crafty Fabrics in Brick. Make sure to read the guidelines (instructions are on our website) on how to prepare your quilt for a longarm. The most common mistake is not providing a large enough backing, which needs to be 8" wider and 8" taller than the top.

Pat L. wishes to thank everyone for doing the Mancuso Show in Oaks, PA., which resulted in \$380 in ticket sales. Pat says we are on a roll with our raffle quilt.

Pat L. handed out books of raffle tickets to those who belong to groups who get together to sew. These books are for the Rebecca Reel quilt guild to help sell tickets for their raffle quilt.

Dona S. spoke with regard to the 2016 raffle quilt. All of the blocks are handed in with the exception of two. Once they are submitted all 12 applique blocks will have been completed and Dona will move on to the next part of the quilt.

Next month will be a "Make It and Take It" meeting, making a yoyo tree. You need to bring in supplies, the list is in the newsletter.

Directories were handed out by Marlene S. If you did not get one please see her.

Jackie announced the guideline for cancellation of a guild meeting due to inclement weather, if the Toms River school district is closed then the guild meeting is canceled as well.

A letter was read by Debbie P. (filling in as corresponding secretary for Susan H.) from Phillip and Laurie Leuthner, who received a Restore the Shore quilt (#117). They thanked us from the bottom of their hearts; they were so grateful.

We proceeded with Show and Tell.

The meeting ended at approximately 8:45.

## SCRAP EXCHANGE & CHALLENGE

1. December meeting: Each person brings 3 coordinating fabrics (each fabric piece 12 1/2 inches sq. or bigger).

Bring fabrics in a bag but not see-through bag.

Each person takes a different bag and makes a 12 1/2 in. block using all three fabrics (one fabric can be minimal but use all three). Block can be pieced or appliqué, embellished or not; be creative.

2. January meeting: Completed blocks are returned to Pru Parcell. Maker's name goes into pool for the final drawing. Pru will put blocks together and machine quilt (size will depend on how many blocks are returned).

3. April meeting: Drawing for a winner.

## QUILT EXHIBIT IN SUMMER 2015

The 4Patchers have been asked to again curate a quilt exhibit for Monmouth University. We are hoping to fill the Pollack gallery with quilts from Rebecca's Reel and Beach Plum guild members.

**Categories:** The previous exhibit was historical. In 2015 we are focused on themes. The examples given are *suggestions* to start you thinking.

Humor                      Modern style                      Liturgical                      Holiday  
Regional—Baltimore-style album, Hawaiian, desert  
Personal celebrations—birthday, wedding, baby, achievement, good-bye, get-well, friendship

Reflections—of a book read, a movie seen, a famous artist or artwork

Political/recycling/living green; refugees, domestic abuse

The natural world—plants, critters, pets, places

Response to disasters—Sandy, flooding, wildfire, tsunami

Various cultures---African, Asian, Amish, Native American

Historical—family history, evoking a particular era

**Entries:** We must receive your entry by April 15, 2015, which includes your name, the category, a description, the approximate size of finished quilt.

A *paper* photo of the quilt, your name, quilt name and the final size must arrive by May 15. More than 1 quilt may be submitted, in any/several categories, by a quilter.

The quilts will be juried, based primarily on creating a balanced exhibit. As you realize, quality of technique will especially matter when there are too many entries in one category.

## Johnsonburg Quilters Weekend Packages


Some of you are familiar with quilters' camp at Johnsonburg NJ. A group from another guild is going the weekend of October 22-26, 2015 and there is room for more. Each cabin has 6 rooms including one private room, two rooms with 3 beds, two rooms with 2 beds and one room with 4 beds. 15 max. The cabins have 4 shared bathrooms (one handicapped). Cedar Lodge has 5 rooms with a bath and 2 bunk beds, with 3 persons in each of the 5 rooms. 15 max. Meals are provided, starting with dinner on Thursday and ending with Sunday brunch. No food preparation means more time for quilting! The cost is \$165 per person. Two night packages (Friday evening through Sunday) are also available for \$115.


