Minutes of September 18, 2015 Meeting

Our meeting began with our President, Jackie P. welcoming everyone including new members and visitors along with pizza for all to enjoy. The meeting was brought to order at 7:00 p.m. The minutes of June 2015 were approved.

Our guest speaker was Valerie Johnson Green, from Caregiver. She has 23 yrs. experience with a group of 1,000 volunteers, serving 3,000 Seniors, from Point Pleasant to Bayville. Caregiver also services Alzheimer's patients, with Ms. Green as coordinator.. They offer visits, shopping, transportation, pet therapy just to name a few, and a bi-lingual staff. Their main objective is to keep seniors in their home as long as possible. Ms Green noted that Marlene is associated with a Motor Cycle Ride, portioned for Caregiver. As she states, "People Work From Their Hearts".



Treasurer's Report—presented by Ann B. Beginning checkbook balance of \$7532.47, total receipts of \$868.00, total expenses \$1,886.90, ending checkbook balance \$6513.57. **Proposed Budget** - 2015/2016. A suggestion was made to increase the donation to Toms River Presbyterian Church donation for use of their facility, Motion to add \$100 was carried and approved. The amount of increase will be revisited next year. A letter of appreciation will be sent to church.

Quilt Cards - First sign your name. This will show Attendance & Charity Quilt donations and qualifiers for June prizes. A Charity Quilt can be submitted for missed month.

Quilt Show - April 9th & 10th, 2016. Challenge Quilt kits were given out by Rita and JoAnn @ \$4.00/kit. No entry fee. Entries will be judged at the March meeting along with a place prize for 1st, 2nd & 3rd; all Challenge Quilt entries will be shown at the Quilt Show.

There will be eight Theme Gift Baskets for the Show. At October's meeting members will select themes.

On Sept. 13th the Island Beachplum Festival was a huge success. \$504.00 total sales; including raffle and items made & donated by members. Next show will be Oct 17th, "Harvest Festival", Toms River. Pat asked for additional items, to sell, to draw people to our table.

Due to the efforts of Laurie S, who entered our Show Quilt into the Photo Contest, we won the Cover in Quilt Shop Directory" NE Edition. See sign-up sheets to pre-order @ \$6.95. Jackie acknowledged the photographer, George Tiedemann, who gave of this time and expertise to prepare the Quilt photo with short notice. A special letter of thanks will also be sent out to him.

Charity Quilts - Marge arranged Saturday, Sept. 26, 2015 as a Charity Quilt Workshop at the Manasquan United Methodist Church from 10 am to 3 pm. Kits already prepared.

Membership - Marlene collected renewal memberships @ \$30.00 along with updated membership forms . Directory to be printed by October meeting.

- * Angel Body—wood spool, dowel, head of angel, wings



Members should bring:

- * Pencil or some kind of fabric marker to trace circles
- * Fabric cutting scissors
- * Needle and thread
- * Fabric for angel dress—nine different fabrics, the largest piece should be about 11" square (circles will be cut at 10", 9", 8", 7", 6", 5", 4", 3", and 2 1/2")
- * Narrow ribbon to tie on dress (approx. 12")

In the bag is the Challenge Fabric, a white flower picture for your "special" challenge addition, the rules and guidelines. **Please note that the white flower can be small, medium or large, it should be in proportion to the item that you are making.** You can make anything you like (only one entry per Beachplum Guild member), within the parameters of the rules. Deadline to turn in your finished Challenge Quilt is our March, 2016 Meeting. During the meeting the challenge quilts will be voted on and awards/prizes will be presented. The quilts will be displayed at the April 2016 Beachplum show in a special display.

This VERY VERY FUNNY story has been making it's way around the interwebs. It's one man's hilarious description of his wife's quilting "habit." It's long but soooo worth the read! An excerpt:

Here's an idea shared by FaceBook friend:

Each quilter should buy a yard each of 7 or 8 coordinating prints and solids. These fabrics are to be used every time you make a test block or a new block you are learning to make. You then save the blocks and before long (maybe) you have a bunch of color-coordinated blocks to put into a sampler quilt. The blocks do not all have to be the same size (you can add sashing around smaller ones if needed).

Don't use this fabric for anything except test block (or the quilt police will come after you).


